Does your child qualify for BHSN?

- Children age 3 17 years old
- With a qualifying mental health diagnosis
- Tennessee resident
- U.S. citizen or qualified alien
- Not in a long-term in-patient or residential facility
- Not in State legal custody
- No family income limits

Eligible services for children with CoverKids or commercial insurance, with or without behavioral health coverage, is determined upon application. The program also helps connect/refer to other behavioral health payor sources and providers to fit each child's needs.
